Welcome to our World Class Trail!

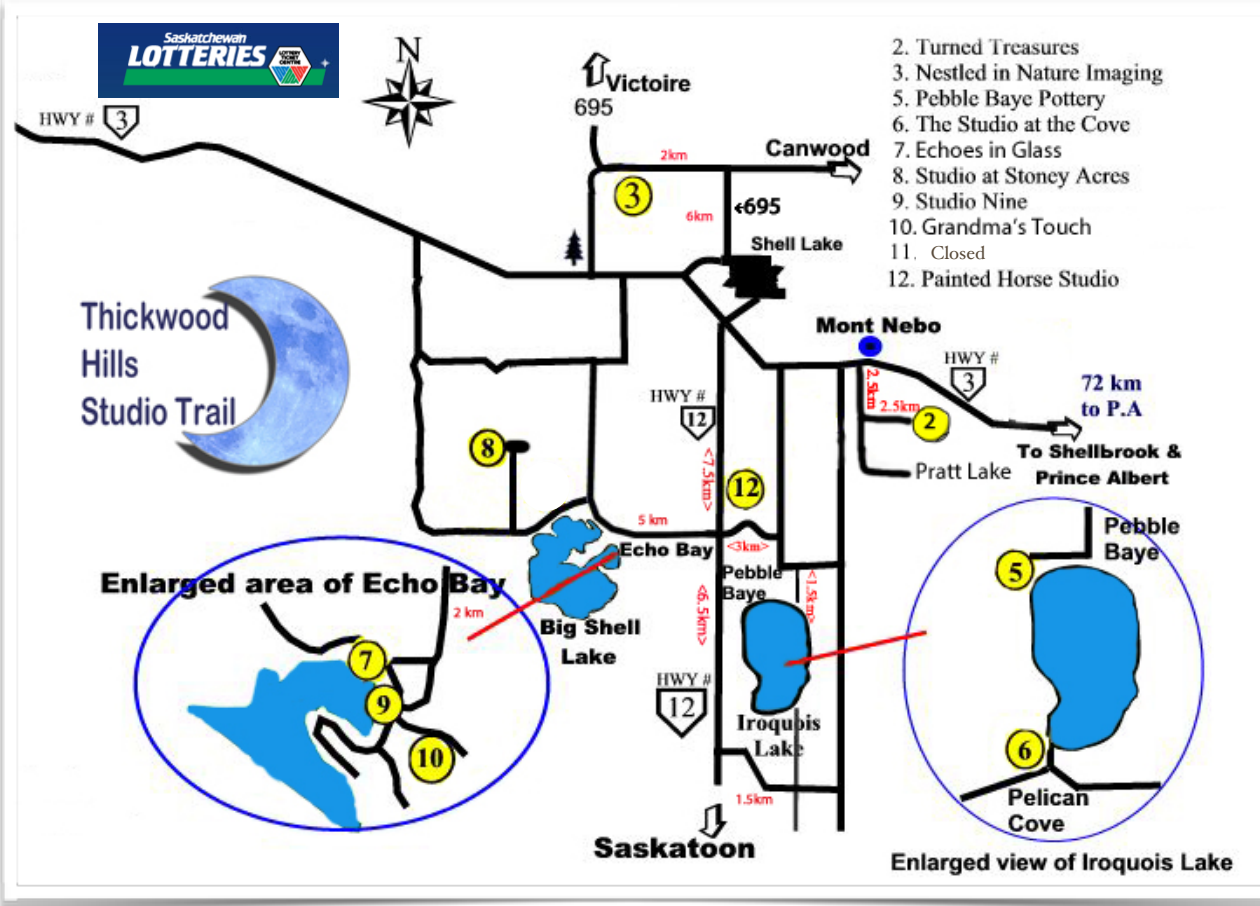
